



Land Use Academy

Overview

The Land Use Academy provides practical education on the fundamental knowledge and skills needed to serve effectively on a local land use commission. The Academy's basic training is offered in locations across Connecticut, allowing commissioners statewide the opportunity to participate. The Land Use Academy is recognized as the state's official certification program in basic land use education for local commissioners. Every commissioner completing the Academy receives a certificate of recognition.

While the Land Use Academy is designed for new land use commissioners and those considering becoming commissioners, it is also useful to current commissioners seeking to update or refresh their understanding of fundamental land use topics.

The Land Use Academy Basic Training program consists of a core curriculum of three courses: Roles and Responsibilities

of Local Land Use Commissions: Map **Reading for Site Plan** Review; and Legal Processes for Land Use Decision Making. The basic training takes place on Saturdays at locations across the state.

In addition to our basic training, the Land Use

In January 2006, the Office of Policy and Management (OPM) recommended CLEAR as "the most logical and most appropriate group to be responsible for the coordination of all land use training of local officials in the state of Connecticut..." Later in 2006, OPM received an appropriation to support CLEAR, and the Land Use Academy was created. While no longer funded by OPM, the Land Use Academy still provides training on a reduced schedule.

Hot Topics Conference

This one day conference is designed for local land use decision makers from Connecticut communities, as well as professional planners, designers, regulators, and others involved in the field of land use. The proceedings are intended to expose participants to a wide variety of agencies, organizations and topics relevant to community land use planning. The conference is presented by the Connecticut Land Use Academy in partnership with the Connecticut Office of Policy and Management, Connecticut Bar Association, and Connecticut Chapter of the American Planning Association. The conference schedule is uncertain due to funding losses-please check the Academy website.
